# 4. First aid measures

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#### **FIRST AID MEASURES**

Eye Contact Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact

lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control

center or doctor for treatment advice.

**Skin contact** Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20
