California Proposition 65 BPS Notification

Dear Valued Customer,

Recent legislation passed by the state of California has created warning label requirements for customers using thermal receipt paper containing Bisphenol S (BPS). These requirements were added to existing California Proposition 65 requirements and are effective December 24, 2024.

To comply with updated legislation, NCCO will add Proposition 65 warning labels to all NCCO thermal product shipped, beginning October 1, 2024. This lead time will allow for our customers to consume and rotate out of any non-compliant product sent to California by the December effective date. NCCO recommends each of our customers read and take the necessary steps to understand and implement compliance on your part that may be required by this legislation. It is likely that our customers purchasing thermal receipt paper containing BPS will similarly need to warn their consumers at the point of purchase; however, each of our customers needs to conduct their own review and analysis. NCCO will not provide indemnity for Prop 65 non-compliance, nor will NCCO accept any returns of non-compliant product.

As an alternative, NCCO provides phenol free papers using alternate, non-BPS color developers. Those chemicals are not affected by this legislation, and do not require warning labels. Bond and carbonless receipt products will also not require a warning label to comply with Proposition 65, as they do not contain color developers.

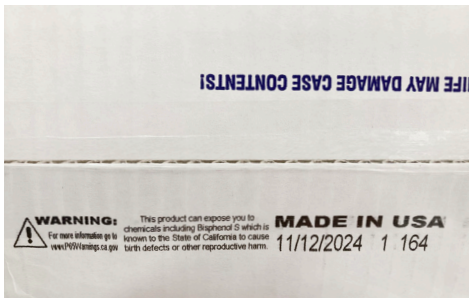
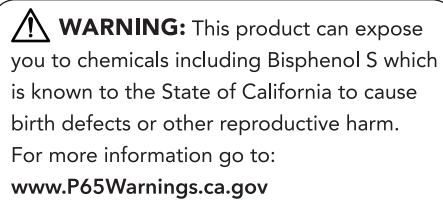

Product Labeling Examples

To ensure compliance with California Proposition 65, NCCO has added the required warning label on impacted products. Below are examples of how these labels appear on both the product itself and the outer packaging.

Proposition 65 Warning

This is the full warning label, it has been applied to all affected thermal products.



Outer Carton Packaging

The warning label will appear clearly on outer carton packaging.



Shrink Pack Label Example

This is how the warning will appear on shrink-wrapped thermal register rolls.



Tray Label Example

This image shows a thermal register roll tray, the warning will appear on the bottom.
